# Themes and events



### **History**

The Mediterranean, steeped in cultural history, boasts 23 UNESCO World Heritage sites, ranging from Alhambra de Granada to Vauban's Fortifications. With influences from Romans, Moors, and various civilisations, its shores reveal the legacy of mighty fortresses, churches, and towns, reflecting centuries of European development.



A Mediterranean cycle tour offers a gourmet journey, showcasing diverse culinary specialties. Indulge in Spanish tapas, Greek moussaka, fresh coastal fish, and exquisite cheeses like Parmigiano Reggiano. Explore wine regions like Piedmont, Friuli Venezia Giulia, Slovenia, and Istria, pairing local wines with truffles and olives. Enjoy exquisite traditional dishes along the whole Croatia's coastline, exeptional wines like dingač and postup on Pelješac peninsula, and fresh oysters in Ston. Savor these delights to refuel for the next stage.



### **Culture**

The Mediterranean and its surroundings serve as both gallery and studio, showcasing diverse artistic eras. Art museums, churches, and historical buildings display original architectures, while the region inspires poets, composers, and thinkers. Examples include the Côte d'Azur, the Egyptian Museum in Turin, and the Fortress castle of Patras in Greece.



### **Nature**

Explore the Mediterranean's natural wonders by bicycle, from the southern tip of Iberian peninsula where the Mediterranean meets the Atlantic, to Provence's lavender fields in France. Discover biodiversity at Italy's Foce Isonzo-Cona Island, cycle through national and nature parks in Croatia, Italy, and Slovenia, and visit Albania's Blue Eye spring and Lake Skadar.





### **Benefits of cycling**

Cycling along the Mediterranean is a win for you, the environment and the local communities! Bicycling is a slow and more respectful way to experience the heritage and culture of the Mediterranean, away from mass tourism and closer to local communities in rural areas.



Cycling has numerous known **health benefits**. Choosing a bicycle holiday helps reduce the risk of developing diseases, including diabetes and several types of cancer, and reduces the risk of developing depression of 17%. And cycling improves your mood, makes you happier and in tune with yourself and the landscape around you.



Choosing your bike for your holidays makes the planet happier too! Cycling is much less pollutant than taking a car, cruise ship, or plane. Cycling saves emissions equaling more than 16 million tons of CO2 equivalents per year in the EU; it implies **less noise, water and air pollution**, so that you help preserve the extraordinary biodiversity of the Mediterranean countries crossed by the route.



Moreover, cycling tourism has **a positive impact on local economies** because it creates durable jobs in peripheric, rural areas. This type of tourism is closer to communities and fosters new enriching exchanges between tourists and the local communities. Mediterranean people are known for their hospitality, openness and friendliness – you will not be disappointed by the encounters on the way!

### **Recurring events**





### Bike day of Málaga

In Andalusia, experience the Bike Day of Malaga, a sportive and festive event in which you can enjoy cycling through the city in the company of thousands of cyclists. It is one of the sportive events with the greatest citizen participation! The Bike Day of Malaga is celebrated in September and coincides with the European Mobility Week. The Bike Day is a participative, non-competitive event, consisting of a 12 km bike ride. Its aim is to promote the use of bicycles in the city as a physical activity and a non-polluting means of transport.

### Pirinexus NON STOP Challenge

The aim is to complete the 340 km non-stop challenge alone within a maximum time of 18 hours, arriving in Girona before midnight. The route is divided into five checkpoints with a set time limit and takes in all types of terrain. All bikes are allowed, although probably the most appropriate ones are gravel or cycle-cross bikes. www.thepirinexuschallenge.com







### FRANCE

### La Voie Aurélia

A non-competitive cycle event that takes place in the natural area of Les Alpilles in Provence. The aim is to discover the numerous cycling itineraries around the village of Saint-Etienne-du-Grès, which is crossed by a section of EuroVelo 8. Four different types of itineraries are highlighted: road bike, gravel, vintage bikes and family. www.lavoieaurelia.com

### Mai à vélo

Created in 2021 by a committee of French bicycle organisations and supported by the Ecological Transition Ministry and the Sports Ministry, Mai à vélo is a national event in the whole month of May. Cycling events, educational projects and public meetings are organised all across France with the aim to promote the multiple uses of the bicycle: leisure, tourism, sport and obviously daily mobility! ### Les « boucles du Haut Var »

Road bike regional race since 2004 settled in the Var Department. Taking place around the village of Rians each year in February, it's a good way to discover during 6 days the beautiful landscapes of some sections of EuroVelo 8.



### ITALY

### **BAM!** (Bicycle Adventures Meeting)

During May, the city of Mantova hosts BAM!, the annual European gathering of bicycle travelers. BAM! attracts enthusiasts from all over Italy and abroad: a gathering to meet friends, share stories, plan trips and above all have fun (in the saddle or not)! There are usually three days of music, meetings with great travelers, writers, artists and professionals, always without any formality or barrier. Get ready to pitch your tent and share the road to get there!



### SLOVENIA

### Istrian cycling marathon

Slovenian Istria with its mild Mediterranean climate provides excellent conditions for cycling until late autumn. In October, when the cycling season elsewhere is almost finished, on the coast it is – quite on the contrary – still warm and cozy, enabling a unique cycling experience! You can choose between three different routes. therefore, the event is suitable for



all levels of recreational cyclists. Part of the event takes place directly on the EuroVelo 8 route. www.istrski-kolesarskimaraton.si



### CROATIA

### Cycle events In Croatia

Croatia offers plenty of cycling events along its more than 1.000 km long route section. CRO Race, an international event, takes place in late September or beginning of October, and usually passes through various destinations and regions on the route such as Split and Šibenik regions, Lika, Zadar region and Kvarner. The Istria300 event starts and finishes in the town of Poreč in Istria, whereas the traditional Uspon na Zavižan race takes place in June in Lika. GranFondo races in Dubrovnik and Zadar regions are also worth attending, alongside traditional events such as MTB Croatia Cup Vodice in Šibenik region and Od Branimira do Branimira bicycle tour in Zadar region.

### GREECE

### **Hellenic Cycling Tournament**

Organised each year across multiple Greek cities, this event promotes the use of bicycle as an alternative means of transport to improve quality of life and protect the environment. The goal is to raise awareness in the local community and activate on issues related to health promotion. school education and road safety. The general theme varies slightly each year but everyone is welcome to claim the streets during this cycling tour regardless of their age, occupation and background.



### CYPRUS

### Cyprus Sunshine Cup

The largest mountain bike race event in Cyprus and one of the most famous and prestigious Mountain Bike Series in the UCI Calendar. Taking place yearly in February/March, the Cyprus Sunshine Cup "Afxentia" Stage Race offers top bikers the opportunity to gain points in the UCI category. "The Challenge" allows non-UCI riders and passionate amateur mountain bikers to compete in the first three stages of "Afxentia" Stage Race and get ranked into their own category with a General Classification at the end. The three stages of the race take place in Lefkara, Lythrodontas and Mantra tou Kampiou.

### TÜRKIYE

### Az Bilinen Antik Kentler Turu

The "Less Known Antique Cities Bicycle Tour" aims to visit the ancient cities of Izmir and its surrounding areas, with bicycles and tents, to see the historical and cultural heritage of the region. Cyclists experience local values and places. A key objective is also to raise awareness and sensitivity about cycling. This event is held between 20-24 April since 2012. The itinerary goes through Panaztepe, Phokai, Mordoğan, Balıklıova, Erythrai, Klazomenai, Bademler ancient sites all of which are on the İzmir section of EuroVelo 8.

# **Signage** and safety

When cycling long-distance, safety is a priority. The cycling conditions and levels of route development can differ from one country to another, and you should always be careful when riding your bike. The signs and regulations can also vary between countries. Make sure to be prepared – follow the roads marked with EuroVelo 8 signs where possible and don't break the traffic rules without knowing them!





### Access to the route

Accessing the trip's starting point via surface transport, carrying your bike on trains or buses, can be challenging. However, considering climate change and environmental concerns, it is a more sustainable option than flying. Here are some possible ways to reach EuroVelo 8 – Mediterranean Route with a bicycle, to help you plan your trip.

EuroVelo is the **European cycle route network** – 17 long-distance cycle routes that cross and connect the continent. It is the largest cycle route network in the world, spanning **over 90,000 km** when completed.

The development of EuroVelo leads to safe and continuous cycle routes, serving as the backbone for national and regional cycle networks. It can be used by **long-distance cycle tourists**, as well as by **local people** making daily journeys.

EuroVelo is developed and coordinated on the transnational level by the European Cyclists' Federation (ECF) in cooperation with a network of National EuroVelo Coordination Centres (NECCs). 

### STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS:

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Start in historic Cádiz, cycling along the Costa de la Luz through San Fernando and Chiclana de la Frontera, with beautiful beaches and promenades. Pedal through charming towns like Conil, Barbate, and Zahara de los Atunes, savoring Atlantic views and fresh seafood. Explore rugged landscapes, visit Los Alcornocales Natural Park, and bike through Andalusian villages, enjoying local character and nature.

### **RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE**

### 'Encañizadas' of the Mar Menor

This is a very special asset which the population of the Mar Menor have had at their disposal for many centuries, and is another legacy from the period of Moorish rule in Región de Murcia. The 'Encañizadas' are a sustainable and ingenious fishing technique which was designed to make the most of the channels which connect the Mar Menor and the Mediterranean Sea.



### For a week or 7-10 days

Begin in vibrant Málaga, cycling along the Costa del Sol, visiting Rincón de la Victoria, Torre del Mar, and Torrox. Reach charming Nerja with its famous caves. Ride through Almuñécar and Salobreña, where you can enjoy the Mediterranean's crystal-clear waters. Explore Almería's natural wonders, passing through Mojácar and its Moorish heritage. Pedal through charming towns like Garrucha and Vera, and enjoy the coastline's allure.

### For 10 or more days

Explore Cádiz, ride the Costa de la Luz, and pass through captivating coastal towns. Pedal through Conil, Barbate and Nerja, discovering the Andalusian coastline. Enjoy the Costa del Sol's beauty, with a taste of Mojácar's Moorish heritage. Complete your journey visiting charming coastal towns and reaching Murcia.



### Province of Cádiz

Tarifa's golden shores, Jerez de la Frontera's rich history, and Grazalema Natural Park's landscapes weave a tapestry of coastal splendor, culture, and wilderness.

### Baelo Claudia and Bolonia Beach

The archaeological ensemble gives evidence of the Roman settlement from 2nd century AD. The natural environment in the Estrecho Nature Park grants Bolonia a place of honour among the best beaches in Europe.

### **Los Alcornocales Nature Park**

The biological wealth and diversity of Los Alcornocales Nature
Park and other natural enclaves form an important part of the Mediterranean forest landscape.

### City of Málaga

The capital of the Costa del Sol boasts a charming historic center with Moorish architecture and a vibrant Andalusian culinary scene. As Pablo Picasso's birthplace, it offers sun-soaked beaches, a bustling port, and a dynamic arts scene with world-class museums and festivals.

### The Region of Málaga

Milenaria Ronda, famous for its romantic legends of bandits; Sierra de las Nieves Natural Park; El Caminito del Rey and the Ecological Park Desfiladero de los Gaitanes; and Málaga's Costa del Sol

### The Caves of Nerja and the Cliffs of Maro-Cerro Gordo

Paraje Natural de los Acantilados de Maro – Cerro Gordo gives the chance of enjoying huge cliffs over the sea, as well as lovely beaches and quiet coves on the coast. With a total length of 4,823 m, the Cuevas de Nerja are a must see!

### The Museums of Málaga

Picasso Museum, located in Buenavista Palace, shows the permanent collection of this artist. The extension of Centre Pompidou in Malaga, with its experimental character, and Casa Museo Thyssen, in Villalón Palace.

### The Region of Almería

The monumental complex of the Alcazaba de Almería; Salinas de Cabo de Gata and its beaches; Cabo de Gata-Níjar Natural Park; and the Caves of Sorbas.

### Cabo de Gata Nature Park and Salt Fields

One of the best preserved natural areas along the Mediterranean coast. The salt fields have a great ecological value as the habitat of several plant and animal species.

### **Erosiones de Bolnuevo**

One of Mazarrón's most attractive places to visit. Known as the "Enchanted City", it is like a strange landscape, almost magical, where the wind and water erosion has created a whimsical rock formation shaped over millions of years.

### City of Cartagena

With more than 3,000 years of history, this city has been the scene of the most outstanding passages throughout time. This Punic, Roman, military and art nouveau city is a must see but you can not leave the city without seeing the Roman Theatre.

### Salinas y Arenales de San Pedro del Pinatar Regional Park

In this protected site for water birds and migratory birds, you can see flamingos, walk along the hiking trails, enjoy a refreshing dip in the sea and watch one of the most spectacular sunsets of the whole coast.



### STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS:

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Begin your journey in Mont-roig del Camp, where the tranquil ambiance of the hermitage Mare de Déu de la Roca awaits. From there, venture forth to Riudecanyes and Porrera. Explore Gratallops for wineries and visit the first Carthusian in Escaladei. On your last day, discover the quaint villages of La Morera de Montsant and El Masroig.

### For a week or 7-10 days

Depart from Tarragona, venturing to enchanting destinations like Tamarit, Torredembarra, Altafulla, and Roc de Sant Gaietà. Days two and three promise exploration in Montblanc, Nulles, Montferri, and Vistabella, each brimming with historical allure. Traverse through Sarral, Conesa, and El Vendrell on the fourth day, immersing yourself in their cultural richness. Conclude your adventure on days five through seven, discovering the idyllic landscapes and charming towns of Santa Oliva, l'Arboç, Calafell, Olivella, Parc del Garraf, and Castelldefels along the way.

### RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE

### Iconic Murcian Tapas

The "Marinera" features Russian salad on a bread-stick ring topped with an anchovy. Without the anchovy, it's called a "Bicicleta." The trick is savoring it whole. Another delight is "Pisto Murciano," a dish of fried peppers and aubergine with tomato. Enjoy it alone or with Spanish tortilla - a scrumptious treat!



### For 10 or more days

On day one, set off from Murcia on a captivating 10-day cycling expedition, meandering through San Vicente del Raspeig, Alicante, Benidorm, and Denia on days two to four. Explore València and Castelló de la Plana on day five, then continue your coastal journey. Cycle through Vinaròs, Benicarló, Peñíscola, La Ràpita, and Amposta on days six to eleven. Your adventure ends in L'Ampolla, having discovered the enchanting Mediterranean coast.

### City of Murcia

The city has Arab origins and a close relationship with the fertile meadow of the river Segura. The local cuisine, folklore, parades and typical products are not to be missed while in the old town. This is the capital of the eternal spring.

### The Cathedral of Murcia

One of the most impressive cathedrals of Spain. Alfonso X. known as 'El Sabio' (the wise). loved the city so much that left his heart when he died, which is still located in the cathedral today.

### **Elche Palm Forest**

Considered the biggest in Europe, the Palmeral, 2 km long and 1 km wide, surrounds the town's historical neighbourhoods and was declared a Human Heritage Monument in the year 2000.

### Maigmó Greenway

Although the railway never actually entered into service, today we can put these feats of engineering to good use as we travel along this enjoyable cycling Greenway.

### Carrascar de la Font Roja

One of the best-preserved Mediterranean forests, each area boasting unique fauna, from mammals to birds.

### Landscape of Serpis River

Covering 12,000 hectares, it's been part of Valencia's Protected Natural Spaces since 2007, boasting a landscape shaped by the Serpis River and rich cultural heritage.

### Albufera Nature Park

A slim strip of coastline protects it from the sea, and on this strip of land, sand dunes have formed. La

Albufera is an important stopover point for migratory birds and a nesting area for resident birds.

### València Historical Centre

The outer ring of the ancient city and the inner area contained within the Moorish walls are full of archaeological remains of civic and religious buildings.

### Sagunto Castle

Within the walls visitors can find innumerable historical treasures from Iberian, Roman, mediaeval or modern epochs. All this is distributed between seven spaces with a formidable panoramic view of the surrounding region.

### Desert de les Palmes Nature Park

A coastal range of mountains, rising up from the otherwise flat La Plana district. Other points of interest are the Bartolo peak (729 m), the castles of Miravet and Montornés, the Carmelite convent or hermitage of the Les Santes.

### Castle of Papa Luna

The castle of Peñíscola is of great architectural interest and conserves important works from the times of the Pontiff. The Papal Basilica of Benedicto XIII is complemented with the throne room.

### **Fbre Delta**

With a 320 square km surface, it is the largest aquatic habitat in Catalonia with a rich biodiversity. Dive with tunas, birdwatch or go along the delta in a kayak! The rice from Ebre Delta is world-renowned for its taste and quality.

### Roman Route in Tarragona

Composed of several UNESCO world heritage sites such as a 1,100 m wall, a provincial forum, a well-preserved Roman circus and an amphitheatre.

### La Rambla in Barcelona

The most famous boulevard to discover in Barcelona. We recommend going early in the morning to feel the flavour of the flowers just as the shops open.

### Prat de Cabanes-Torreblanca Nature Park

One thin line of shingles, pebbles and sandy deposits separates the sea from a marshy area formerly known as the home of ducks (Albalat dels Ànecs). 

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

A family-friendly journey from Perpignan to Rivesaltes, delving into Gothic history, birdwatching, and scenic beauty. Cycle along the Agly River's greenway, passing through Rivesaltes, known for its Muscat grape. Return to Perpignan by train. You will cover distances from 17-42 km, featuring stops at Sainte Marie la Mer, Canet en Roussillon, and Torreilles Plage, for a memorable blend of history, nature, and leisure.

### For a week or 7-10 days

A route to discover the rich landscape and some of the heritage treasures of the Girona counties and the plain of Vic through cycle paths and guiet roads. Begin in Figueres, cycling along the Muga Nature Trail to Sant Llorenç de la Muga, then continue to Albanyà. Traverse the forest tracks of Alta Garrotxa to reach Castellfollit de la Roca before riding along roads to Camprodon. ### Museum de la Mediterrània in Torroella de Montgrí

The museum provides an interactive experience, engaging visitors in the aromas, sounds, and history of the Mediterranean. It offers a panoramic audio-visual presentation on the region's contemporary reality.

### Museu de l'Anxova i de la Sal in L'Escala

The museum of salt and anchovy shows the history of fishing and salting blue fish from the XVII century to nowadays. A unique heritage and knowledge of Catalonian coast.

The cork museum preserves, interprets and highlights the heritage of the world structure around the cork.



For a 3-day heritage tour, start in Beaucaire, passing St Gilles Abbey and Aigues-Mortes, traversing with greenways and quiet roads, with medieval cultural richness.

On the first day, set out on a journey through Provence, cycling through the Pays d'Aix area, covering 61 km from Meyrargues to La Roque d'Anthéron. Cradle of the global perfume industry - the perfume and flavour industry employs 2,700 people for a turnover of 600 million euros - it has just been labeled by UNESCO as Intangible Cultural Heritage for "Perfumerelated know-how in the Pays de Grasse".

Conclude the adventure with a 28 km return trip to Manosque. Discover picturesque landscapes and historical landmarks along this captivating route.

### For a week or 7-10 days

Explore La Dracénie - an untouched gem in Haut-Var's hills - by following EuroVelo 8 in under 5 days. Then, venture into Var's hinterland and the Côte d'Azur for 3-4 more days. Finally, savor a bike and wine tour through Italy's Langhe, Roero. and Monferrato regions. Rolling hills, vineyards, and UNESCO heritage sites await in these exquisite destinations.

### For 10 or more days

Witness a cycling odyssey through picturesque landscapes and charming towns. Begin in Manosque, heading to Nice along scenic coastal routes, exploring Menton. A beautiful Mediterranean resort village with its own marina on the French Riviera. Make sure to visit the Ancient Greek inspired Villa Kerylos built in the early 1990s by Theodore Reinach.

### **Attractions in Monaco**

If you deviate a bit from the itinerary, you can visit Monaco and its famous sights and attractions such as the Monte Carlo Casino. Port de Fontvieille, Formula 1 Grand Prix circuit and the 'Jardin Exotique'.

### Promenade du Soleil in Menton

With the beach on side and the city on the other, experience the quintessential Mediterranean

### Val Rahmeh Botanical Garden in Menton

garden houses many tropical and subtropical plants from Asia and South America. It was once only accessible to the nobility but opened to the public in 1967.

### Plage des Sablettes in Menton

You can find this splendid beach beneath the city's Saint-Michel Basilica. It offers a great view over the French-Italian border.

Take a break on the sandy shores of the city. The beach is accessible by a cliff-side path which leads to clear waters and a spectacular view of the Mediterranean.

### Giardini Botanici Hanbury in Ventimialia

Known as one of the most beautiful gardens in Italy, it was established in 1867 by Sir Thomas Hanbury on a small. steep peninsula overlooking the sea. Make sure to check its vast collection of plants!

### The Riserva Bianca in Limone

One of the oldest ski resorts in Italy. The ski area of the Riserva Bianca has over 80 km of slopes.

### City of Cuneo

Located near several mountain passes, the city is 500 m above sea level. Cyclists can visit its famous museums and monuments. Foodies should not miss Cuneo's specialty. the Cuneesi al rhum, small meringues with dark chocolate coating and a rum-based filling.

### Duomo di Saluzzo

Built in 1491, this historic cathedral stands out for its Lombard-Gothic style. Inside, you can admire the Baroque high altar and the 14th century wooden crucifix.

### City of Turin

Significant industrial center and the birthplace of FIAT, boasts a rich cultural heritage. Don't miss the UNESCO site. Residences of the Royal House of Savoy, along with the National Museum of Cinema and the Egyptian Museum. Take a leisurely stroll along the picturesque Po Riverfront for a taste of Parisian charm amidst the stunning backdrop of the Alps.

### Corona di Delizie

The Corona di Delizie (Delights Crown) is a 90 km cycle ring encompassing the Residences of the Royal House of Savoy (UNESCO site) and the most beautiful natural and cultural gems around Turin. The three most important castles are the Valentino's one (today Architecture Faculty of the Politechnic), Rivoli (Museum of Contemporary Arts) and Venaria, famous for its garden. You can have a challenging excursion climbing the Superga hill or just take a stroll along the "Murazzi" (walls of the Po).

Immerse yourself in the Venetian lagoon and the fishermen's village of Chioggia, before reaching Lido di Venezia on the soon-to-be-completed Ven-to (Venice to Turin) cycle route!



### STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS:

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

South of the Po, in the Piedmont provinces of Asti and Alessandria, is Montferrat (Monferrato), an extraordinary, hilly wine region that is worth a detour on two wheels. A hearty cuisine - with agnolotti, stuffed fresh pasta, as a main course - and excellent wines such as Moscato d'Asti and Barbera will be the perfect reward for a day spent on the bike.

### RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE

History and biodiversity of the Po River Delta
The Po river is famous for its flora and fauna;
its delta, the mouth of the river going into the
Adriatic Sea, is a treasure of biodiversity and one
of the most important nature areas in Europe.
370 bird species and almost 1000 plants make it a
paradise for birdwatchers, especially in the spring.
Cycling is the best way of experiencing the Po
river delta as it respects its small inhabitants.



### For a week or 7-10 days

The Po has several tributaries that stream from the Alps, forming natural parks. Cycle upstream, leave the Po to cycle north and explore the natural reserves of the Mincio river. The city of Mantua, with its stunning Ducal Palace, is immersed in the Mincio Natural Park. Some more days on the bike will take you to Lake Garda, along EuroVelo 7 - Sun Route.

### For 10 or more days

This stretch of EuroVelo 8 is between the land, the river Po and the sea. Cycle on EuroVelo 8 until Ferrara, and then take a detour south: cycle in the flatland all the way to Ravenna, the ancient capital of the Byzantine Empire. Stop to see its mosaics, churches and mausolea, do not miss Dante's tomb, and then head back north, towards Venice, along the coast. Valli di Comacchio, the Po river delta, and the Venetian lagoon will be your quiet companion, and you will almost feel like you are cycling on water.



### Cremona

The city of luthiers has a notable musical history. Stradivari is likely its most famous citizen and a tour of the Violin Museum is a must for every cyclist that is into classical. baroque or Renaissance music.

### Polirone Abbey

Situated in San Benedetto Po main square, the abbey was founded in 1007 and soon became one of the most important abbeys in the north of Italy. In 1513, Correggio painted the refectory, while in 1537 Giulio Romano entirely renovated the church

### Mincio River Park

History, archaeology, art and the environment intersect in the territory of the Mincio Park. Cyclists can visit protected areas, Nature Reserves and Sites of Community Interest that can be found along the routes marked or in their immediate vicinity.

### **Southern Oglio Park**

In this area straddling the provinces of Mantua and Cremona, cyclists can visit the Nature Reserve "Torbiere di Marcaria", interesting from a naturalistic and landscape point of view.

### Oltrepò Mantovano Parks – MaB UNESCO "Po Grande"

Make sure to visit and enjoy the green scenery at the local parks in San Colombano, San Lorenzo and Golene di Foce Secchia e del Gruccione.

### Grana Padano and Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese factories

Cyclists can book a visit to local cheese factories, where two of the most famous PDO cheeses in the world are made!

### Ferrara

The Po used to flow in Ferrara until the 12th century, and is not that far today. The medieval city of the Este family is famous for its Diamond Palace, castle, and other

palaces and galleries. All cyclists will feel at home, considering that its inhabitants largely move around by bicycle.

### Chioggia

A smaller version of Venice. Chioggia is a typical fishermen's village in the Venetian Jagoon, with narrow streets and canals and is indeed famous for its fish market. A true pearl of the Adriatic.

### Lido di Venezia

Venice's beach, in the short stretch of land protecting the fish-shaped city from the Adriatic Sea. It gets exceptionally lively between August and September, as it is the home of the world-famous Venice Film Festival. Watch out for the red carpet!

### Chartreuse of Pavia

Founded in 1396, the Chartreuse is one of the most renowned monuments of Renaissance art in Italy. The building was completed in 1542 and was also used as a "mausoleum" for the Visconti dynasty. The church features cloisters for ceremonies and where the monks lived, worked and prayed absolutely alone. The guest rooms currently accommodate the Museum of the Chartreuse. The whole complex is surrounded by fields, lawns and vineyards. Inside, the church hosts valuable paintings, sculptures and decorations.

### Venice to Rijeka



### For a week or 7-10 days

Embark on a multi-day cycling trip from Koper to Opatija, beginnning on the famous Parenzana trail to Portorož. It's worth taking a detour to visit the resort city of Piran if it fits into your travel plans. Crossing into Croatia, reach the charming town of Umag. Cycle along the coastline to Novigrad and explore its fishing tradition and continue to Poreč, where you can marvel at the UNESCOlisted Euphrasian Basilica. Browse the charming Rovinj Old Town and explore Lim Bay. Cycle inland to Labin, then onward to Opatija, known for its elegant architecture and scenic promenade.

### For 10 or more days

Embark on an extraordinary cross-border 10+ day cycling adventure through the Brkini hills. The region is nestled between the Karst and Kvarner, between Slovenia and Croatia. Leave the Adriatic coast to explore the scenic interior, with its green hills and stunning views over the Kvarner Bay. Enjoy low-traffic rural roads and countless trekking and mountain bike trails. The Brkini region is connected to the coast by bus, as well as to Pula by a scenic regional train with bicycle carriage.

### Lignano Sabbiadoro

One of Italy's most renowned seaside resorts.

### City of Aquileia

UNESCO World Heritage site with one of the Early Roman Empire's largest and wealthiest cities.

### Isola della Cona

Natura 2000 protected area within the Foce dell'Isonzo Natural Reserve, boasts the best birdwatching in Italy along the last 15 km of the Isonzo River.

### City of Trieste

Immerse in the heritage of this port city, featuring a medieval old town, a neoclassical Austrian quarter, and the must-visit Miramare Castle.

### City of Koper

Once an island and salt panning town, its Venetian Republic legacy boasts remarkable architecture. Today, it thrives as a commercial and tourist hub, expanding its offerings with seaside resorts, nautical tourism, and shopping.

### Izola

Once an island, retains its unique maritime heritage, offering beaches, orange wine, water sports, and traditional events celebrating local gifts.

### Piran

A salt-grown town, protected as a cultural monument, features a medieval wall, narrow streets, and a central square, embodying its Mediterranean charm.

### Euphrasian Basilica in Poreč

Bulit in the 6th century, it is the historical and cultural monument of global significance, also recognised by UNESCO.

### Aquarium in Pula

Set in Fort Verudela, an 1886 military fortress, the aquarium uniquely blends Pula's military history with the Adriatic's richness.

### Rovini old town

The old town core, a protected historical complex, is the most wonderful and interesting part of Rovinj. It is rich in numerous Romanesque-Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque, Neoclassical windows, balconies, gazebos, portals, staircases.

### Roman Arena in Pula

Among the world's six largest surviving Roman amphitheaters, uniquely preserving all three Roman architectural orders. Built in the 1st century AD, at the same time as the magnificent Colosseum in Rome, Arena was once the site of gladiator fights.

### Učka Nature Park

Explore the Park, including Mount Učka and Ćićarija range, known for unique climate and lush forests, offering hiking trails with stunning views from Vojak, Učka's highest peak.

### Opatija

A charming seaside town and a famous 19th-century health resort, celebrating 180 years of tourism. One of its most famous landmarks is the 10 km long coastal promenade called Lungomare, that stretches from Volosko to Lovran.

### Riieka

Rijeka is the main seaport and the third-largest city in Croatia. Browse its vibrant City Market, situated just next to the sea shore, where the local fishermen once used to unload their catch and take it in baskets to the market to sell.

### Trsat Castle in Rijeka

Important strategic plateau atop a 138 m high hill overlooking Rijeka bay, witnessed triumphs over centuries by various powers, inspiring Marshal Laval Nugent to purchase and restore the castle ruins in 1826. It now houses his 'Peace of the Heroes' mausoleum.

### Rijeka to Zadar

Heading south of Rijeka, you can still take in some of the Adriatic views overlooking the islands of Krk, Cres, Lošinj and Rab, before moving inland and enjoying the more rugged terrain and Lika. This nature-lovers paradise takes you through Otočac, where the cool waters of the river Gacka entice you to take a break and possibly try your hand at fly fishing. As you near Gospić, stop by Smiljan and the Nikola Tesla Memorial Centre, where the inventor was born.

Travelling down from the North West, the stage passes through the town of Nin, a true historical gem, and follows beautiful beaches until the ancient city of Zadar, which was founded in the 9th century BC, brimming with reminders of the various civilisations that have ruled this area, including the remains of the original Roman Forum.

### **Zrmanja River Canyon**

Immerse yourself in the mesmerizing beauty of the Zrmanja River, renowned for its crystal-clear waters and the breathtaking 200-meter-deep canyon carved into the karst landscape. As you navigate its path, marvel at the striking contrast of the gleaming white rocks, verdant green riverbanks, and vibrant hues of the surrounding flora, creating a scene so captivating it will leave you in awe.



### STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS:

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Start your journey in vibrant Rijeka and pedal to the late-Renaissance Nova Kraljevica Castle. Continue on scenic landscapes to Bribir, taking a pause to soak in its historic charm. Visit Novi Vinodolski and cycle to Krasno Polje and make sure to visit the modern Velebit House nearby to learn more about the area's geology, cultural heritage and species. Conclude the last day in Otočac and explore the old water mills on the Gacka River near Sinac.

### For a week or 7-10 days

Begin in Rijeka, renowned for its astronomical center and vibrant market, then pedal to Bakar for stunning viewpoints and Nova Kraljevica Castle. Explore historic Bribir's cultural heritage before heading to Smiljan to visit the Nikola Tesla Memorial Centre. Cycle through scenic Gacka Valley to Lovinac, then ride to Zrmanja River Canyon for its rugged beauty. Conclude your adventure in Zadar, exploring its historic charm and witnessing the sunset over the Adriatic Sea.

### For 10 or more days

Embark on a cycling journey from Rijeka to Gorski Kotar, exploring Risnjak National Park's pristine wilderness. Cycle to Otočac for cultural tours along the Gacka River. Visit the Nikola Tesla Memorial Center in Gospić before pedaling through the Velebit Mountains. Explore geological wonders around Gračac and outdoor adventures in Obrovac. Conclude in Zadar, discovering ancient history and the captivating Sea Organ.

### The Routes of the Frankopans

Members of the noble Frankopan family held important social and political positions - they were princes, bans, viceroys and warriors, supporters of art and poets, and finally political revolutionaries, so their lives were an inspiration to many artists. The Routes encompass seventeen castles and fortified towns, including ones in Bribir, Novi Vinodolski, and Kraljevica, and three sacral complexes.

### The Vinodolski Zakonik, Novi Vinodolski

One of the most important Croatian documents and one of the oldest European legal documents written in a national/ popular language and not in Latin, was published 736 years ago in the square in the Novi Vinodolski castle.

### Nikola Tesla Memorial Center

The great inventor, physicist and discoverer was born in 1856 in the village of Smiljan, and his birth house has been turned into a memorial center. Along with the interpretation of Tesla's life, the landscape of Tesla's identification is also presented, as the native land which shaped him as the great inventor that he was.

### Velebit House

Velebit House is a visitors and information centre of the Northern Velebit National Park. It is located in the Village of Krasno, one of Croatia's largest mountain settlements. Its recognisable, modern and attractive content makes it possible to present the natural and cultural values of the Park throughout the whole year. Here you can find out what to

visit and to experience in the Park, Krasno and its surroundings, and buy tickets and souvenirs.

### The Gacka River Springs

On the Gacka and its tributaries, there were roughly sixty mills in operation during the 20th century, but only a small number of them are still in operation now, milling using the river's power for their age-old task. They keep the memory of a long-gone craft here by keeping it in the harmony and synergy between man and nature, serving as an embodiment of their coexistence.

### Cave Park Grabovača

Cave park Grabovača is the only cave park in Europe wich invites visitors to experience the magic of underworld. On this small area it's possible to find eight different caves and one pit. They represent diverse and valuable cave stone and crystal formations – 25% of all protected caves in Croatia are located here.

### National Park Paklenica

The park stretches over kilometers of magnificent pine forests. Its beech forest complex is inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List and it's a heaven for any hiking enthusiast.

### Historical town of Nin

Nin is the oldest royal Croatian town. Today, Nin Riviera is a modern-day tourist destination that offers all types of activities and a rich cultural and historical heritage.

### Zadar Old Town

Its City Walls are added to UNESCO's World Heritage List and guard this historic city-museum in the open with its Roman Forum and famous St. Donatus church.

### Sea Organ and Greeting to the Sun. Zadar

The unique installation built in the underwater part of the city quay creating the unique 'sea music' and 300 multi-layered glass plates with solar modules producing impressive show of light at night.

### **Plitvice Lakes National Park**

The Plitvice Lakes National Park is Croatia's best known national park and the Croatian natural jewel that is on the UNESCO List of World Heritage sites, covering a total area of 300 square kilometres. The beauty of the Park lies in its sixteen lakes, interconnected by a series of waterfalls, and set in deep woodland populated by deer, bears, wolves, boars and rare bird species. By a network of paths, visitors can get around and access the numerous waterfalls and the rocky lake shores easily.

Zadar is a 3,000-years old city with unforgettable Romanesque churches and contemporary architectural installations such as the Sea Organ and the Greeting to the Sun. Šibenik, one of the oldest Croatian cities is an imaginative game played by its UNESCO-protected heritage, invaluable heritage and Dalmatian lifestyle. While in Split region, plan your time for exploring Diocletian's Palace, as well as the historic core of Trogir, and stunning natural landscapes. Finally, Dubrovnik and the city's glorious walls, fortresses and bastions offer a view of the magical Elaphiti Islands, scattered like pearls in the azure of the Adriatic Sea



Embark from historic Zadar and pedal on to Ugljan and Pašman Islands, famed for their serene beauty. Rest in Biograd, rich in history and coastal allure. Cycle to medieval Šibenik the next day, home to St. James' Cathedral, a UNESCO site. Explore Šibenik's cultural riches before ending your memorable three day trip.

### **RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE**

### **Diocletian Palace in Split**

In the early 4th century, Roman Emperor Diocletian built a vast palace, which was a combination of a luxurious and richly adorned villa and a military camp fortified by towers and walls. Today, it is one of the most significant works of late-ancient architecture, showcasing original features and pioneering designs that influenced early Christian, Byzantine, and early medieval art. This stunning site served as Meereen in the famous 'Game of Thrones' TV series!



### For a week or 7-10 days

Surrounded by lush greenery and pristine waters, cycle from the serene Vransko Lake Nature Park towards Šibenik, where the majestic St. James Cathedral dominates the skyline. Explore Šibenik's historic forts before continuing to Trogir, a UNESCO-listed medieval gem with cobblestone streets. Continue to Split, buzzing with life around Diocletian's Palace. Experience adventure in Omiš and relaxation in Makarska before concluding at Baćina Lakes, a tranquil kayaking paradise amidst untouched nature.

### For 10 or more days

To fully experience what this stage has to offer, start in Zadar, cycling across the picturesque Ugljan and Pašman Islands. For the next two days, explore Biograd's rich history, then pedal on to Šibenik to visit the magnificent St. James' Cathedral. Cycle the next few days discovering Trogir and Split's historical treasures before reaching Omiš and Makarska, where coastal beauty meets outdoor adventures. Finish in Dubrovnik - the "Pearl of the Adriatic" - where ancient history, art, and culture come to life, leaving you with cherished memories.

### View from the Ugljan & Pašman islands viewpoints

If you are looking for stunning views, head over to the islands of Ugljan and Pašman. St Michael Fortress and Ćokovac Monastery will give you an insight to the Zadar Archipelago.

### Nature Park Vransko Lake

Stretching across both Zadar and Šibenik region, Nature Park Vransko Jezero is the largest natural lake in Croatia and a wellknown ornithological reserve for 251 bird species!

### Betina Museum of Wooden Shipbuilding, Murter Island

Just a brief detour from the route, this Museum gives insight into the long tradition of small wooden shipbuilding in Betina, paying tribute to the generations of local shipbuilders.

### Croatian Coral Center, Zlarin Island

Easily reached by boat from Vodice, the Croatian Coral Center on Zlarin island tells the story of the centuries-old tradition of coral cultivation on this small island in the Šibenik archipelago.

### The Cathedral of St. James in Šibenik

Built entirely of stone, the UNESCO listed cathedral is famous for its frieze decorated with 71 sculptured faces of men, women, and children.

### St. Nicholas Fortress in Šibenik

This triangle shaped fortress, situated at the entrance to St. Anthony Channel was built in the 16th century to protect the city from the Turkish sea attacks.

### The historic core of Trogir

UNESCO site and one of the oldest Mediterranean towns that showcases 4,000 years of history from the Hellenistic to Renaissance, Baroque, and Gothic periods.

### Salona Amphitheatre

Salona, ancient capital of Roman Dalmatia, rests by the Jadro River delta, its amphitheater, a 2nd-century marvel, once a hub of entertainment, hosting up to 19,000 spectators in the city's northwest.

### Park-forest Marjan in Split

Don't miss Marjan Hill in Split for its breathtaking panoramic views, a green oasis rich in historical and cultural landmarks, including numerous churches and chapels, symbolising the city's essence.

### The Cetina Canyon

Protected landscape since 1963 which offers a unique blend of diverse landscapes in Omiš, attracting adrenaline seekers and adventurers.

### Skywalk Biokovo

A spectacular lookout point located in the Biokovo Nature Park, in the shape of a horseshoe outside the cliff and with a glass floor, overlooking Makarska riviera and islands.

### Symbolic Brela Stone

Brela's emblematic Kamen, the smallest Adriatic island, is a breccia formation with unique vegetation along Croatia's coast. Breccia, Italian for "free gravel", denotes a rock of cemented mineral fragments.

### The Baćina Lakes

A complex of seven natural lakes, six of which are interconnected, surrounded by mountains. A place of untouched nature and rich wildlife. Cyclists can enjoy lakeside paths that connect the lakes.





### RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE

### The Pearl of the Adriatic

Dubrovnik is a living monument rich in both tangible and intangible heritage. Recognised by UNESCO in 1979, its historical core has maintained its unique character over centuries, evident in its magnificent city walls. The city's Festival of St. Blaise, added to UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage list in 2009, further underscores its cultural significance. Discover the famous Fort Lovrijenac, that was a key filming location for the famous TV series 'Game of Thrones', and do not miss out on Renaissance-style Sponza Palace and the Cathedral, showcasing remarkable art pieces.



### **STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS:**

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Cycle from Dubrovnik to Cavtat along the scenic coastline, exploring historic sites and seaside cafes. ### Town of Cavtat

### Sokol fortress

Dating back to Roman times, the fortress offers stunning panoramic views of the Konavle region amidst its Cyprus trees.

### Lake Skadar

The largest lake in the Balkans. It has an average depth of 5m and it is a true oasis for all nature lovers.

### Rijeka Crnojevica

One beautiful small historical place, in Central part of Montenegro. In ancient time was an important trading route through Montenegro.

### National Park Lovcen

The National Park Lovcen is located in the rocky region of the Dinaric Alps. The slopes of Mount Lovcen rise steeply from the coastal region of Budva and the west of Cetinje.

### Old Town in Kotor

Preserves its rich history, culture, and traditions, notably seen in its ancient city walls. Construction began in the 9th century, with additions over the next ten centuries, earning UNESCO protection.

### Blue Eye in Albania





### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Begin in Durrës, and get captivated by the grandeur of its ancient amphitheatre. Cycle along the picturesque coastline to Sterberg, where azure waves kiss sandy shores and a cozy restaurant beckons with savory Albanian dishes. Journey onward through rustic landscapes to Fier, where the ruins of Apollonia whisper tales of antiquity, offering a glimpse into Albania's rich archaeological heritage amidst culinary delights.

### For a week or 7-10 days

You can slowly explore Albania or reach the border of Greece with a higher tempo. Cycle south to Orikum, relishing views of Llogara Pass and the Ionian Sea. Continue embracing Himarë's coastal charm and pristine beaches. Do not forget to rest and indulge in seafood delights. After, head to lively Sarandë to visit the UNESCO-listed Butrint. ### Divjakë-Karavasta National Park

Spanning a territory of 222 square km, the park has been identified and has gained international importance for its great availability of bird and plant species. The park has great biodiversity and features wetlands, forests and salt marshes that make it a perfect attraction for wildlife enthusiasts.

### City of Fier

Located in the center of Albania, this industrial city is renowned for its rich ancient Greek heritage. Cyclists should visit the attractions such as the Monument of Agonothetes, House with Mosaics and the Ardenica Monastery.

### **Apollonia**

One of the most important ancient Illyrian colonial settlements. Ruins of this ancient Greek city are situated near Fier and the river Vjosë next in modern-day Albania.

### Vjosa-Narta Protected Landscape

Located in the southern part of Albania, this protected landscape area covers spans for 194 square km. Known for its sandy beaches, wetlands along its significant bird and plant species.

### City of Vlorë

One of the economic hubs of Albania, the city is home to Albania's second largest port. You will find several ancient Greek heritage locations such as the Independence Monument, Muradie Mosque, and the ancient Kanine Castle. Due to its port, there are plenty of seafood and other delicacies on offer.

### Mount Çika

Standing at about 2044 m above sea level, it is the highest peak of the Ceraunian Mountains. The mount is also part of the Llogara National Park, which is noted for its rich biodiversity and vegetation.

### City of Sarandë

A city in southern Albania, after the Albanian Riviera, known for its unforgettable beaches and colorful spring blooms.

### Sagiada

This fishing village is the westernmost point of mainland Greece and stretches between the lonian Sea to the west and mountains on the Albanian border to the north. Don't forget to visit the spectacular Sagiada Marina by the beachfront!



Continuing along this route, you will encounter the enchanting coastal town of Messolonghi, celebrated for its tranquil lagoons and its connection to Lord Byron.



### RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE

### Koukoumitsa's Island in Vonitsa

A serene gem nestled in the bay opposite Vonitsa, connected to the mainland by a charming bridge. Its tranquil ambiance draws many visitors seeking solace and spirituality, who often make a pilgrimage to the chapel of the church of Saint Nekarios to light candles. The island's beauty and spiritual significance make it a cherished destination for locals and tourists alike.



### For a week or 7-10 days

Start in Igoumenitsa and pedal along the scenic route, leading to the Amvrakikos Gulf Wetlands National Park, Arta, Amfilochia, and Vonitsa, enjoying the beautiful landscapes and coastal towns. Cycle from Vonitsa to Mytikas, reveling in the coastal views and Greek charm. Explore Mytikas and head towards Astakos, passing through Aitoliko and Messolonghi. Marvel at the sights as you travel through Antirrio and finally reach the charming coastal town of Diakopto.

### Katopodeio Folkloric Museum of Paleros

This folkloric museum presents traditional life with recreated household spaces, daily tools, and vintage shops like a barber and grocery store.

### Vasos Katraki's Museum, Centre of Engraving Art

The museum in Aitoliko houses Europe's sole collection of engraving art, featuring 500 works by acclaimed artist Vaso Katraki. It also includes a basement designed for art education.

### **Ancient Plevrona**

On a hill northwest of Mesolongi Ancient Plevrona. The hilltop ruins

### Municipal Art Gallery, Messolonghi Museum of History and Art

Stone Town Hall, a two-storey neoclassical building of 1931. Its collection includes paintings and copies of scenes from the Exodus of Mesolongi, There are also exhibited objects and manuscripts of Lord Byron.

### **Museum of Kostis Palamas**

It is a well-preserved stone twostorev mansion, built in 1708. which was the home of Greek poet Costis Palamas. The museum's collection includes photographs, personal items, and many exhibits about the life and work of the great poet.

### Museum of Charilaos Trikoupis

The Trikoupis Museum is housed in a mansion building, near the Messolongi lagoon, where the historian Spyridon Trikoupis was born and lived. In its halls there are reminders of the Trikoupis family. personal items and photos.

### Dieksodos, Center of Dialogue and Art

It is a Historical Museum which is placed in the house of Thanasis Razis Kotsikas. It owns more than 6.000 records and heirlooms from the wider area of Messolonghi.

### Ancient Calidona

It is one of the oldest cities of Aitoloakarnania, the most important city of Ancient Aetolia.

### **Ancient Theater of Makinia**

The ancient theater of Makinia belongs to the wider archaeological site of the homonymous Aetolian city. The theater is located southeast of the acropolis and has a great view of the gulf of Patras and the bridge of Rio simple visit.

### Antirrio's Castle

Known as the castle of Roumelis today named Antirio's castle, hosts art gallery and maintenance workshops of Byzantine and Post Byzantine antiquities.

### **Rio-Antirrio Bridge**

The world's longest multi-cabled bridge with a continuous and fully suspended deck of 2,252 meters. Its foundations are deep in the sea reaching up to 65 m.



Take a detour to discover the rich history and mythology that envelops this ancient sanctuary, built on top of an imposing, rocky hill to the north of the Acrocorinth, an emblem for the Greek city of Corinth, reflecting its growth and prosperity. It remains one of the few standing Archaic Greek Temples in the world.



### For a week or 7-10 days

Head to Aigio, with an optional visit to its Archaeological Museum, and then continue along the coastline to Diakopto, surrounded by endless olive and orange groves. Enjoy a scenic hour-long ride via the "Odontotos" rack railway, through the gorge of Vouraikos, up to historic Kalavryta. Continue to coastal towns of Xylokastro and Kiato, and from there to Corinth where the Temple of Apollo awaits. Ride through Loutraki over a couple of days and rest your body at its thermal spas, located at about 7 km off the route.

### For 10 or more days

You can tackle the whole stage at a relatively easy pace over 10 or more days. Start your captivating cycling journey in Patras and pedal to Aigeira, exploring ancient walls nearby before heading to Kiato. Continue to Corinth to marvel at the ancient Temple of Apollo. Cycle leisurely towards Loutraki and indulge in its thermal spas with a short detour. Uncover Greek marvels over the next few days like Megara, Eleusis and Salamina towns' historical charm – Eleusis is easily accessible from Megara via the suburban railway (Proastiakos). Your journey ends in Athens, where the Acropolis and Plaka neighborhood offer a cultural feast just a short ride away.

### City of Patras

Located 8 km from Pio, this city is a commercial hub, busy port and a nodal point for trade and communication with Italy and the rest of Western Europe as well as the Ionian islands. Every year, in February, the city hosts one of Europe's largest carnivals (over 180 years old), the Patras Carnival.

### City of Aigio

Located 35 km from Patras, Aigio, the capital of Aigialeia is a port town on the Gulf of Corinth. The city is built amphitheatrically in three levels with a magnificent view of the Corinthian bay. In the lower city, at the seaside, the old raisin warehouses made of stone have been converted into cafes, bars and taverns, while in the higher levels one can visit the historical center of Aigio.

### City of Diakopto

Approximately 15 km to the east of Aigio is Diakopto, a small city near the Vouraikos river and at the lower end of the Vouraikos Gorge.

### The Diakopto-Kalavryta Railway

Built in 1885, it leads up to the town of Kalavryta, passing by the Mega Spilaio Monastery.

### Lake Tsivlou

Surrounded by the slopes of Mount Helmos, you have the opportunity to choose between walking, mountain biking and off-road rides along the trail surrounding the lake.

### Loutraki

A seaside resort on the Gulf of Corinth, well known for its vast natural springs and its therapeutic spas.

### City of Eleusis

One of the five sacred cities of Ancient Greece, together with Athens, Olympia, Delfi and Delos, known for the Eleusinian mysteries of goddess Demeter and daughter Persephone, attracting initiates from all over the ancient world. The procession to Eleusis through the Sacred Way (the oldest road in Greece) began at the Sacred Gate in the Kerameikos (the ancient Athenian cemetery), near the Athens Acropolis. Eleusis was named the European Capital of Culture for 2021. The archaeological site is certainly worth a visit before following EuroVelo 8 to Athens.

### City of Athens

Undoubtedly one of the most emblematic cities worldwide, where history unfolds around the sacred rock of the Acropolis, reflected upon monuments and artifacts dating back to antiquity, and expressed throughout architectural heritage of the 19th and 20th century. The best way to enjoy an Ancient Athenian panorama is to cycle around the historic centre's old neighborhoods and its narrow alleys steeped in 6,000 years of history.

### **STAGE EXCURSION**

### Loutraki, a seaside resort on the Gulf of Corinth

For cyclists coming from Corinth, Loutraki can be reached via a submersible bridge installed at sea level at the end of the Corinth canal, by the harbour of Poseidonia. Loutraki is bordered by the Gulf of Corinth in the west, while the Geraneia mountains dominate north and east. Enjoying therapeutical treatment at the renown ancient thermal spas, cycling and/or walking by its long beach, visiting the exotic ancient temple in Perachora, a sanctuary of the goddess Hera situated in a small cove of the Corinthian gulf at the end of the Perachora peninsula, passing by the picturesque Vouliagmeni lagoon, are a few short trips worth taking before leaving the town. Loutraki is also well known for its Casino (Club Hotel Casino Loutraki), one of the biggest in Europe.



### A tour of İzmir

The İzmir section of EuroVelo 8 spans 17 districts, linking Lesbos and Chios Islands to Dikili and Çeşme ports, traversing historical sites and ancient settlements from Pergamon to Ephesus. Covering 500 kilometers, it features 17 ancient cities, offering diverse attractions including summer tourism, agricultural paths, local cuisine, and welcoming communities.



### **RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE**

### Aegean coast by bicycle

Explore agricultural landscapes from Dikili to Pergamon, with highlights like the ancient city of Kyme. Enjoy scenic sea views from Aliağa to Foça, with stops at Foça Castle for fresh seafood. Discover Çiğli's Bird Paradise and cycle to İnciraltı City Forest. Explore charming villages before concluding the journey in Ephesus via Sığacık, offering a diverse cultural and natural experience.



### **STAGE CYCLING HOLIDAY IDEAS\*:**

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

In summer, you can go to Selçuk district by train via İzmir Airport. Here, the Ancient City of Ephesus, the Temple of the Virgin Mary, the Seven Sleepers and the Historical Şirince Village can be visited by bicycle. You can also go swimming and camping on the Pamucak coast.

### For a week or 7-10 days

Embarking on a week-long bicycle tour of İzmir unveils its vibrant city center, scenic peninsula, and more. Cyclists cover 35-40 kilometers daily, exploring cultural landmarks and historic districts. Further adventures lead to vineyards and coastal paths, offering stunning Aegean Sea vistas and culinary delights. Charming campsites and boutique hotels along the route provide cyclists with comfortable accommodations amidst the region's natural splendor.

### For 10 or more days

The entire stage can be completed by travelling 40-50 kilometers per day in a tour of 10 days or more. After entering the route from Dikili district, which is the entry point of the route, and visiting the Ancient City of Pergamon, you can stay in the camping areas in the Foça region. Then you can reach the city center with a 1-day journey. After the peninsula tour, you can visit Teos Ancient City and Selçuk District, stay in Ephesus Ancient City, Historical Şirince Village and Pamucak Beach, and return via the airport by train.

\* NOTE: During the summer season, it is also possible to reach the EuroVelo 8 itinerary in Izmir via a ferry from the Greek island of Lesvos. The ferry arrives at Alsancak in Izmir and connects the two cities at least twice a week.



### City of Kyme

The most important af the Aeolian Confederacy cities is located south of Bergama. It was settled near the ancient Pythicos River and enjoyed extreme prosperity from its fertile agricultural lands and position on the sea.

### **Bird Paradise**

289 bird species live around an 8.000 hectare area in the Ciğli Camaltı Salt Marsh. Some of the observed bird species are Flamingos, Grey Herons, Silver Seagulls and Redshanks.

### City of Phokaia

Present-day Foça had this name during the Ancient Age and Byzantine Empire. It is one of the 12 Ionic cities.



A TOUR OF IZMIR

### Izmir Clock Tower

Historic clock tower located in the Konak district of İzmir. One of the meeting points of Izmirians. From there, you can walk through Kemeraltı (bazaar), go to Kızlarağası Hanı (inn) and also walk to Asansör (historical elevator).

### **Inciralti City Forest**

Popular area in Izmir where locals bike, exercise, stroll and picnic where the sea meets the forest.

### Balıklıova Village

Situated at the southernmost point of the Karaburun Peninsula. Famous for its Turkish shortbread, there is a cooling wind at the village even in summer. Çeşme Castle and Museum Built in 1508 by the Ottoman ruler Beyazit II. Recently renovated, visitors can climb up on either side of the castle to have a 360 degree panoramic view of Çeşme.

### **Teos Antique Site**

This city, which is located 5 km to Seferihisar, was one of the 12 Ionian cities. The first structure upon reaching Teos is the Dionysos Temple built by the famous architect of the Hellenistic era. Hermogenes. Other structures include the Antique Port, the Agora, Cistern and Antique roads to the southeast of the Theatre.

### Sığacık Castle

Dates back to the Seljukian period. The local bazaar held on Sundays is a place where the people sell their fresh products and handmade goods.

### House of Virgin Mary

Located on the top of the "Bulbul" mountain 9 km ahead of Ephesus. the shrine is the place where Mary may have spent her last days. Made of entirely of stones, it features the "Water of Mary". a source found at the exit of the church area where salt water, with curative properties, can be drunk by all.

### **Pergamon-Ephesus Ancient Cities**

The acropolis of Pergamon was the capital of the Hellenistic Attalid dynasty, a major centre of learning in the ancient world. Monumental temples, theatres, stoa or porticoes, gymnasium, altar and library were set into the sloping terrain surrounded by an extensive city wall. Located within what was once the estuary of the River Kaystros, Ephesus comprises successive Hellenistic and Roman settlements founded on new locations, which followed the coastline as it retreated westward. The Ancient City of Ephesus is an outstanding example of a Roman port city, with sea channel and harbour basin.

### For a weekend or 2-3 days

Start in Larnaca and pedal northward to picturesque Paphos. Along the way, soak in the endless coast and Mediterranean vistas, visit ancient archaeological sites like Kourion, and indulge in seafood delicacies at seaside tavernas. Discover the island's history and natural beauty, all while enjoying a relaxed weekend getaway.

### RELATED TO THE THEME OF THE STAGE

### Discover a crossroad of civilizations

Immerse yourself in the island's heritage by visiting Roman ruins, such as the awe-inspiring Roman Villa of Dionysos in Paphos. Venture further to discover the legacy of the Frankish era with medieval fortresses like the Kolossi Castle and Buffavento Castle. Complete your cultural odyssey with vibrant and traditional folk dances, including "halay," "kasap," and "horon."



### For a week or 7-10 days

Begin your journey in Limassol, a bustling city boasting ancient wonders like Kourion Archaeological Site and Limassol Castle. Cycle along the scenic coastline the next day, passing Akrotiri Salt Lake with its vibrant flamingos. Explore Troodos Mountains, visiting traditional villages like Omodos and Byzantine churches on the following days. Discover history at Kolossi Castle and enjoy a traditional folk dance performance in a quaint village. End the seven day trip in Poli Crysochous, a coastal town with serene beaches - the perfect way to unwind.

### For 10 or more days

Cycle from bustling Nicosia, exploring ancient city walls and the Cyprus Museum. Then, head to Kakopetria, where you have the option to hike Caledonia Waterfall, and discover Kykkos Monastery. Relax in Platres before continuing to explore historic Paphos and a visit to Akamas Peninsula and Polis. Return to Paphos, then cycle to Limassol for beach relaxation or castle exploration. Conclude your journey back in vibrant Nicosia, where you can explore any sights you missed, shop at local markets, and enjoy the vibrant city atmosphere.



### City of Larnaca

It is built on the site of the ancient city-kingdoms of Cyprus, making it one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in Europe. In the winter months, thousands of flamingos, wild swans and other migrating birds make their annual stopover at the nearby salt lake.

### City of Paphos

UNESCO World Heritage Site that was the capital of Cyprus in antiquity. Numerous archaeological sites can be seen from the centre of the modern town down to its picturesque harbor. It is out of the seas of Paphos that Aphrodite is said to have risen.

### City of Limassol

The second largest city of the island. It boasts many antiquities, Byzantine and Frankish monuments. Today Limassol is the island's main port, the centre of the island's wine industry and a major tourist resort.

### Sculpture Park in Agia Napa

A place of natural beauty and panoramic view. The park currently features 250 sculptures by 215 international artists.

### Thalassa Municipal Museum in Agia Napa

The museum aims to show the impact and the significance of the sea upon the history of the island. Cypriot antiquities, a life-size exact replica of the ancient ship Kyrenia II as well as fossilised fish, shells etc are exhibited.

### Finikoudes in Larnaka

Finikoudes (palm trees) promenade is Larnaca's most popular coastal road and beach, and the heart of the city's tourist life. It owes its name to the palm trees planted along the way.

### Saint Lazarus Church in Larnaca

The magnificent 9th century stone church of Agios Lazaros is one of the most remarkable examples of Byzantine architecture in Cyprus.

### "Aliki" Salt Lake in Larnaka

One of the most important habitats in Europe for waterfowl. Flamingos, wild ducks and other water or shore fowl find refuge there during their migratory iournevs in the winter.

### **Amathus Archaeological Site** in Limassol

Remains of the ancient citykingdom of Amathus and an important site of worship of the goddess Aphrodite-Astarte, dating from the Archaic period up to the Roman and Christian period.

### Molos & Castle Square in Limassol

The seafront promenade, the Old Port area, the Limassol Marina and the Medieval Castle Square. all within walking distance. offer a wide variety of cafes and restaurants.

### **Kourion Archaeological Site** in Limassol

One of the most impressive archaeological sites in Cyprus. The Greco-Roman theater, originally built in the 2nd century B.C., is still used for selected cultural events.

### Petra tou Romiou in Paphos

A striking geological formation of large and tall rocks. According to Greek mythology, Aphrodite, the goddess of love and beauty, was born there

### Kato Pafos in Paphos

UNESCO-listed waterfront promenade with a medieval castle and archaeological parks boasting some of the most beautiful ancient mosaics in the world.
